From the door to hell to the Chernobyl exclusion zone, these places are sure to make you uncomfortable with their disturbing vibrations. Beating noises, mysterious screams and apparitions are just some of the scary possibilities in famous places like the Amityville house and the doll island. When it comes to a list of the most spectral places in the world, you can count on these sites to keep you awake at night. Known as the "Sea degli Alberi", the Aokigahara Forest looks fascinating in appearance with lush and green trees. It's beauty attracts tourists and hikers, but unfortunately, many visitors are lost in the dense forest and cannot ask for help because their mobile phones do not work in the forest. GPS systems and compasses also malfunction inside all trees. courtesy photos: jimmyan/Stock/Getty Images More Some locals think these devices stop working because of the magnetic iron in the forest terrain. Others believe it is the work of demons, according to Japanese mythology. To make things worse, the icy forest is also famously called "Suicide Fort", because of almost 100 people a year walking in the forest, never come back. Xochimilco houses one of the most disturbing islands in the world: Isla de las Muneacas or Island of Dolls. Hundreds of dolls are scattered around the island, hung on the trees and tied to the walls of the buildings. The only way to access the island is by boat – if you can convince the captain to take you. No one occupies the island today, but once it was the home of a man now deceased named Julian Santa Barrera, having found a girl drowned in a nearby canal. Barrera started stabbing everywhere until his death. Some locals say that Barrera did this to prevent evil!The torched hill of the crosses is actually a place of pilgrimage that exists since the fourteenth century. The exact origin of the hill remains a mystery, but in the course of its history, the Hill of the Cross has created many controversies. In the 1940s, the locals continued to add crosses to the site to honor the rebels who died for Lithuania's independence. The Soviet Union, which occupied Lithuania at the time, did not like it, so the Soviets destroyed the site three times. Today, the Hill of the Crosses is a tourist hotspot to capture the sight of roaming ghosts and hear disturbing noises. Tuol Sleng has an extremely disturbing past. Once in high school, the site was turned into a high-security prison by the Khmer Rouge. Almost 20,000 prisoners occupied Tuol Sleng, and became a torture and execution center that supported an estimated 18,133 lives. courtesy photo: Christian Haugen/Flickr Today, it serves as a museum with thousands of photographs of the victims. Some torture chambers remained intact after the Khmer Rouge were thrown out of the city. The locals say that the ghosts of those who didn't get him out of prison, wander alive for the halls and rooms. If you are interested in practicing black magic, you can find everything you need in a street market in West Africa known as Akodessewa Fetish Market. It is the largest voodoo market in the world that sells different types of animal remains. Patients who cannot afford treatment in a hospital or pharmacy visit the Akodessewa Fetish Market to buy medicine and talk to a local healer. Trying to treatfrom influence to curses, patients bring home unique objects such as talismans, charm and feet of elephant. Imagine how difficult it would be if you had to wear a gas mask!Life. This is exactly what life is like for residents on the island of Miyake-jima. Their lives depend on often wearing gas masks because they occupy an active volcano. courtesy photo: public domain During the history of Miyake-jima, the island escaped several times when Mount Oyama eruppe. Now, a constant flow of poisonous gas releases from the volcano, prompting officials to demand locals to bring gas masks at all times. When toxic gas levels in the air jump up, alarms wind up throughout Miyake-jima to warn residents to put on their masks. Visitors can access the island by ferry or plane. In the northwest corner of the Niagara Falls there is a tunnel with a legend that haunts. The locals say a girl hid in the tunnel to escape a nearby fire, but then she died inside her walls. Visitors reported a lot of paranormal activities, including ghost noises, poltergeists and strange orbs. He lived in isolation until his death, and his ghost is said to haunt the soil, creating cold spots. The couple mysteriously disappeared after their uncle, rich king iii, took the throne. Other signaled spirits include henry vi, lady jane grey and margaret pole. the stanley hotel is known for having frightened stephen king to write the shining. at the hotel, the lights turn on and turn off, and the doors open and close themselves. the sounds of laughter and footsteps can be heard when no one else is around. In the middle of the Karakum desert, a burn-down sitscalled "door to hell." The pit was not always on fire. the area was a regular field until 1971, when Soviet engineers began to drill the site for oil. shortly after, they accidentally met a natural gas pocket, and the field collapsed into an underground cave. courtesy photo: Tormod Sandtorv/Flickr engineers thought it was better to focus the pit to burn the dangerous methane gas. They thought the gas would burn within a few weeks, but the crater was burned for more than 40 years. Christ of the abyss is a collection of statues under the water of Jesus created by the sculptor guide cocks, has spread its sculptures around different ocean floors. photo courtesy: microgen/Stock/Getty images plus the giant deity with his hands and head raised in the depths of the ocean gives a spectral atmosphere that gets even more frightening with increasing algae and corrosion. the Christ of the abyss in Italy proved so badly that they had to remove and clean the statue several times. If you want a haunted deck, the Christ of the abyss is exactly what you need. the most devastating nuclear explosions in history took place in pripyat. the chernobyl disaster of 1986 has caused almost 200,000 victims, and the exclusion zone of chernobyl is still radioactive today. Can you even imagine how much bat poops accumulate? Guests slip on bat waste while sailing through the millions of cockroaches crawling everywhere. Damn! Centralia, Pennsylvania, was the inspiration for Silent Hill, the horrible video game and movies. Once a city engaged with successful coal mines, Centralia slowly began to shine and die after the mines mysteriously caught fire in 1962, and the city could not put fire out. They also grew worried when a child fell into a 150-foot sink hole that released a poisonous level of carbon monoxide. Now, Centralia is a ghost town, and experts estimate that fire could continue to burn for more than 250 years. Located 200 miles from Delhi, the abandoned Fort Bhangarh is in the middle of a desert. The empty fortress looks like a normal ancient ruin, drawing many visitors to the site while the town is out. However, at night, it is a completely different story. No one is allowed to visit the Fort of Bhangarh after sunset, especially because it is reported one of the most haunted places on the planet. According to the local legend, a sorcerer cursed the fortress after a princess rejected it. The elegant Queen Mary served as a shippopular, sailing on the North Atlantic Ocean between 1936 and 1967. However, after years of service, Queen Mary was forced to retire in 1967 due to age and reduced profits. The ship permanently docked in Long Beach, California, California, finally converted into a hotel and tourist attraction. Mysterious knocks at the door when no one was around became common, and the bathroom lights started to turn on and turn off themselves. Locals say they're being persecuted by ghosts of people who disappeared on board. Built in 1796, the Myrtils plantation is one of the most haunted houses in America. First, the plantation is supposedly built on a native American burial ground in St. Francisville, Louisiana. More than 12 different ghosts presumably call Myrtils Plantation home. One of the most famous spirits is a former slave named Chloe, who spent his last moments alive in the house. The ghost of a young American native woman was also reported. The Winchester Mystery House might have the most disturbing design on Earth. Includes stairs leading to nothing, windows overlooking other rooms and doors opening on drops of 10 feet or brick walls. Bizarre, right? Her husband was the treasurer of the Winchester Repeating Arms Company. He thought the ghosts that haunted the property were the victims of her husband's weapons. In response, Winchester created a dizzying maze inside the house to confuse ghosts. Now, the gigantic mysterious house is a famous tourist attraction. As one of the largest castles in Europe and one of the Seven of Romania, the Castle of Corvin is a fairytale castle that many tourists enjoy visiting. The legend states that the historic transylvanian castle is also the site where the cruel and bloody ruler, Vlad Vladimpler, he was imprisoned. courtesy photo: public domain as most people know, vlad was also known as dracula and inspired the famous vampire legend. Many legends are characterized by the castle of corvin, including a story of two prisoners who are stuck in a well, becoming eternally trapped in the property, even in the afterlife. as a result of these legends, countless paranormal sightings occurred at the castle of corvin. sagada, Filipino, houses one of the most unique burial rituals in the world. instead of putting coffins in the ground, sagada premises are distinguished by hundreds of coffins in the caves and along the rocky walls of the cliffs. has been a common practice for over 2,000 years. courtesy photo: david Carmona/500px/Getty images the positioning of the coffins has to do with the state and conviction that the spirits would have reached a higher nature in the afterlife. sagada coffin hanging are difficult to reach, and many visitors say that others should respect the burial tradition and see the site from afar. in the 18th century, archaeologists hoped to find hidden treasures as beautiful monuments and frescoes in the catacombs of holy priscilla of roma. Unfortunately, they discovered that the catacombs were destroyed, and the legend says that the tombs were devastated because the ghosts haunted the cursed cemetery. According to archaeologists, some of their crews met angry spirits, who pushed their carriage into a nearby river. courtesy photo: DeAgostini/Getty holy images priscilla the catacombs also aroused controversy when experts realized that the frescoes showed what could have been female priests guiding a mass, an event that scandalizes and alters the Catholic history. Consequently, it is believed that the Catholic Church has vandalized the catacombs to cover the eventof the 18th century. Nagoro, Japan, has a narrow aging and the young population, causing the village to relax in time. the former resident and artist ayano tsukimi took things in his hands returning toand bring the city back to life in the most unexpected way. Some visitors find the creepy and disturbing dolls, but the toys are there to stay and are the new unofficial citizens of the village. Only 30 real humans live in Nagoro. A fall of 2,000 feet could certainly take a fear of heights to a new extreme. This is exactly what happens when visitors fall down the cliffs at North Yungas Road in La Paz, Bolivia. Named "Death Road", this destination supports 200 to 300 lives a year. The lack of guardrails and limited visibility in the rain and fog also add to the dangerous reputation of the road. Currently, it became a hotspot for wild bikers instead of drivers. On the shore of San Francisco, California, there is the former military and federal prison called Alcatraz. From 1934 to 1963, the famous facility hosted many prisoners, including the Mafia Al Capone, Bumpy Johnson and George "Machine Gun" Kelly. Located in Long Island, New York, Amityville is where Ronald DeFeo, Jr., took the life of his family members in 1974 a year after the tragic accident, the Lutz family moved into the house and enjoyed a great start — for a few days. It was so bad that the family left the house after only 28 days of life there. Many people didn't believe their story, but when they did tests on the lie detector, they found evidence. gettysburg battlefield is known as the most haunted place in the world, during the civil war, the battle of gettysburg continued for three days and became the most bloody battle in the history of the United States. More than 50,000 Americans have lost their lives, and thousands of other soldiers have been wounded or disappeared. courtesy photo: tetra Images/Getty images many lives ended violently on the battlefield of gettysburg, so it is not a surprise that it is now a paranormal hotspot. The brown spirits wander in the fields and in the neighboring houses. Some locals say that restless spirits are looking for their weapons and companions. Do these ghosts know the battle is over? during World War II, the Japan invaded semarang, Indonesia, and took control of a building owned by the first railway company in the eastern Dutch indies, calling it lawang sewu. In Japanese, lawang sewu means "half-way." they turned the building into a prison, and the basement was oated for executions. courtesy photo: arief broto Susilo/Flickr consequently, many ghost stories involve lawang sewu. tourists reported seeing ghosts and ghouls. The most famous is a Dutch woman who died in the building, another entity reported in lawang sewu is kuntlianak, a vampire ghost in Indonesian and Malaysian mythology. most bays are haunted by snakes and gators swimming in muddy waters, but a swamp!Louisiana has a unique look that makes it creepy. Located near New Orleans, Manchac Swamp is the most spectral swamp thanks to a curse and a strange agguata beast.
