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Roleplay chat meaning

By texting her "I'm at the supermarket. Just bought a gallon of milk, anything else you want me to get?" you are throwing her a bait text for her to latch on to. She can now decide to play along, or not... but you test the waters in a low-risk way. Want more examples? You've got it. 4 Example Roleplay Ideas You Can Use With a Girl Over TextLet's begin with the first. Roleplay Ideas 41: The "Serious Opinion" MimeThis is a fun one. First, you text the girl "I need an opinion on something" ...which does a couple of things.It throws a hook of curiosity that gets her texting back wondering what your question. Of course, this is just a setup for the element of surprise...After she texts you back wondering what it is that you want to ask her, that's when you knock her off of her autopilot by saying something like "I'm thinking about quitting my job and becoming a mime." And now, you've thrown her a "bait" text with roleplaying potential. Here's an example of a text conversation I had using this technique: How to Get Her OutAs soon as you've got her engaged and her buying temperature spiked... you can suggest meeting up by telling her you two should get together to train for the European "mime" mission. The specific reason you give her to meet up with different "serious opinion" texts that don't even involve mimes so it wouldn't make any sense to tell her you need to train for the mime mission. Okay, onward to roleplay idea #2. The Future Adventure Projection love this one. This type of roleplay consists of a "future" adventure you are having with the girl. It's not just effective, but (when done right) can be a lot of fun... and it can lead to setting up a date. Here's an example of how I employed this technique on POF. Frankie: Let's run away together Girl: Let's go! I've got the getaway car... Where's the rendezvous point? Frankie: Switzerland. After long days running a swiss cheese factory, we'll spend our nights robbing sidekick. Let me go grab my passport Frankie: You seem to have the attitude that I like when it comes to heist sidekicks... But let's at least have a first date... You know, to make sure you're not really a 350 pound asian man @Girl: Hahaha I'm glad I qualify. But yeah for sure we can come up with our game plan on our date haha. Do people really get catfished on here? I just joined so I'm kinda new to all of this. LolFrankie: Yup, I've seen some get told they're going to some European country to rob banks or something and they completely fall for it @Girl: Lol that sucks. Someone should go warn those poor women. I definitely wouldn't fall for some cheesy trick like that... I can see right through it lol @Frankie:I trust that you wouldn't fall for any el cheapo tricks like that... that's why I'm enlisting you as my elite heist sidekick... Gimme your number and we shall discuss more about it. Girl: (###) ###-###As you can see, I was able to escalate this roleplay scenario into a date. As you go through these types of roleplay... you may start noticing a pattern of how to handle the logistics problem of spinning a text conversation into a date. Roleplay Idea #3: The Fake Past Adventure ProjectionThis one's a close cousin of the future adventure projection... except you pretend as if you and the girl have a "history" together. One way I do this is to send her a picture of a cheesy romance novel cover... and pretend it's an old picture of us. For example... Here's how to start this roleplay. Whenever she mentions something she's good at, or an area where she has experience, tell her you're "hiring" her to help you with it. This not only compliments her skill and ability, but it also frames you as being in a position of POWER. For example, if she seems like a smart girl, say: "You seem like a smart girl who's on the ball. I'm hiring you. From now on you're my personal party planner whenever I have friends come to town."You get the idea. You can "hire" her to do anything. If she's good at cooking... she'll be your personal trainer. Now the fun part is that when she says something corny or lame, you can "fire" her: "Omg, I can't believe you just said that. That's it. You're fired. Time to look at the resumes of the other applicants;)"Most importantly, remember that this push and pull game is all in good FUN. You're not trying to be mean. You're simply trying make her laugh and put a smile on her face without acting like a low-value clown and still being in control. Godmodding Godmodding refers to the action of a player giving their character an elevated level of control and power not normally allowed in a typical session. Many rules have been given against godmodding, which is not confined to a limited set. In most cases, a player cannot jump into a roleplay conversation without expectation and doing so may break the session, or another player will try to divert the perpetrator. A player is not allowed to kill another player instantaneously, and many games have the option to toggle health. For example, a player can say (His/her health decreases from the tackle), but they cannot say (He/She dies because he/she has a heart attack). A player says they are immortal and cannot die (Person1 hits Person2 with an axe and slashes off Person2's head) (Person2 is headless and still alive and is immortal). This can be unfair to Person1 and may cause arguing. The player's character is able to regenerate a missing limb or body part. (Person2 regrows his/her left arm back). Player's character (depending on game and roleplay) finds a weapon in the middle of nowhere as well as without warning and picks it up or summons a weapon for their use in combat and battle (depending on the roleplay; if it is a fantasy roleplay, summoning weapons would be allowed, but doing so in a war-genre roleplay is considered godmodding since the player cannot magically summon themselves a shotgun while in combat). In-country or nation roleplays ('build a mini country' games where players build and roleplay as countries on a map of the world), example of godmodding would be for example, (Brazil and Argentina sends a fair amount of 4 navy ships, which is godmodding) Another example would be, (Brazil nukes Argentina thus ending the war after blowing up Argentina's capital of Buenos Aires, which is godmodding since nuking a country to end a war is a bit idiotic, extreme and causes an abrupt end. In some cases nuclear weapons in nation roleplays are banned, depending on the game). A player kills another character without permission, especially during a fight. Go-Getting A "Go-Getter" is a roleplayer who prefers to do their roleplaying alone, or in very small groups hinting limited to no contact with larger groups/factions. It is not generally a problem in the roleplaying sense, however, story and plot points can become broken and mislead, resulting in various discussions and breaking the roleplay session. Frame-catcher as them. This usually happens in roleplay games with morphs of characters. When a frame-catcher sees someone with the same character, they confront them and say that they are fake and ask to prove that they are "real", a problem with it is that it can disrupt a roleplay with already set canon characters of a series or franchise, making it an easy to avoid issue. It is uncommon to insert quotations for characters to speak, however, players can see them typically in people who use correct grammar more often. The * (asterisk) symbol (pressing the shift key for the number 8 on the keyboard) is put around a sentence to indicate action by words. For example, if a player was to pick up an object from a table, the player would simply type '*picks up item off table*'. Parentheses are placed around sentences that go outside of the session.
